Card Stock:

Cajun Craze – 11” x 4-1/4”
Early Espresso – 4-1/4” x 4” (Cut 2)
Early Espresso – 4” x 7/8”
He’s The Man DSP – 4-1/8” x 3-7/8”
He’s The Man DSP – 3-7/8” x 3/4”
Basic Beige – 4-1/8” x 3-7/8” (Inside)
Early Espresso Scrap
Basic Beige Scraps

Stamp Positioner (Stamparatus)

Instructions:

1. Score the Cajun Craze 11” x 4-1/4” on the long side at 5-1/2” and 4-1/2”. Fold in half at 5-1/2” and then fold back at the 4-1/2” score line. On the inside glue the 1” section together. This will form the book fold.
2. Attach the Early Espresso 4-1/4” x 4” card stock pieces to the inside of card and one to the front of the card.
3. Attach the Early Espresso 4” x 7/8” card stock to the left side of the card front as shown above.
4. Attach the He’s the Man 3-7/8” x 3/4” DSP to the left side of card as shown above.
5. Attach the He’s the Man 4-1/8” x 3-7/8” DSP to the right side of card front.
6. Stamp image from the He’s All That stamp set onto a Basic Beige scrap using the Cajun Craze stamp pad. You may want to use the stamp positioner to get a darker image. Cut out using the detailed oblong die from the All That Dies set. Then, using the rectangle die from same set, cut out the Early Espresso Scrap. Attach the stamped piece onto the Early Espresso piece using regular adhesive. Then attach to card front using dimensionals.
7. Using the argyle dies from the All That Dies set, cut out two Basic Beige scraps. Attach to card front as shown above.
8. Attach the Textured Dots to card front as desired.
9. Stamp verse from the Very Best Occasions stamp set onto the Basic Beige 4-1/8” x 3-7/8” card stock using the Cajun Craze stamp pad. Attach the He’s The Man 3-7/8” x 1/2” DSP to the left side of this piece and attach to inside of card. You are now done!!
